

Family Court

Note: Most of these matters can also be dealt with in BC Supreme Court. For divorce and division of family property, you must go to Supreme Court.

Family Law in BC | *information pages & step-by-step guides*

- ◆ Filing & setting aside agreements, child protection/removal, fees, drafting affidavits & court orders, enforcement, Family Maintenance Enforcement Program (FMEP), financial statements, serving documents, etc.
- ◆ Trials in Provincial Court: roles in the courtroom, steps during a trial, how to prepare a trial book, filling out forms, Family Case Conference checklist, etc.
